CHAIR PHYLLIS J. RANDALL

Phyllis J. Randall was elected Chair At-Large of the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors in November 2015 and reelected in November 2019. Her election was historic as she became the first person of color in Virginia's history to be an elected chair of a county Board.

As Loudoun's Chair At-Large, she represents Loudoun on various regional, state and national bodies including, serving as Chair of the Virginia Association of Counties Health and Human Resources sub-committee, Chair of the Northern Virginia Transportation Authority, President of the Washington Metropolitan Council of Governments (COG) and member of the COG Board of Directors as well as a member of the COG Human Services and Public Safety Policy Committee and the COG Regional Forward Coalition, and member of the National Association of Counties Health and Human Resources Committee

Chair Randall also serves on the Board of Supervisors' Finance/Government Operations and Economic Development Committee and the Transportation and Land Use Committee.

In June of 2018, Chair Randall was selected as one of only twenty-five women in the country to be included in the 2019 class of Governing Magazine's Women in Government Leadership Program. In addition, in 2018, 2019 and 2020, the citizens of Loudoun County voted Chair Randall Favorite Public Official, an honor which she is most humbled by and proud of.

From 2009-2011, Chair Randall served as Chair of Virginia's Fair Housing Board under Governors Tim Kaine and Bob McDonnell. From 2014 to June of 2018, she served as Chair of Virginia's State Board of Corrections under Governor Terry McAuliffe.

By profession, Chair Randall is a mental health therapist, working with substance abusing offenders in an incarcerated setting, a position she enjoyed for over fifteen years.

She and her husband Thaddeus (T.W.) have lived in Loudoun since 2003, and are the proud parents of two sons, Ashon and Aaron.

This program gives hope to students who may not see their lives after high school going in the traditional route such as college.

Dennis Godfey volunteers at the Catholic Charities Diocese of Arlington. Dennis handles the administrative side, checking and double checking to make sure payments to the landlords and utilities are completed. Thanks to Dennis and his administrative support for the COVID-19 emergency rent and utility relief program, a total of \$1,167,719 was distributed between 4/1/20 and 2/23/21. This assistance enabled 595 Loudoun families to stay in their homes and keep their utilities connected. When the COVID-19 relief program was launched in April 2020, the incoming call load quickly reached 200+ calls and continued to rise before staff was completely trained. Dennis volunteered a total of 108 hours on the phones and a total of 576 hours on the COVID relief program.

Every week the Food Donation Team goes to various merchants in Loudoun County to pick-up food donations and deliver them to Tree of Life. They also delivered food to Loudoun Hunger Relief. The donations are distributed to people experiencing food insecurity throughout the community in Loudoun County. These eight volunteers have continued this effort throughout the COVID-19 Pandemic, because of their kindness, thoughtfulness, and deep sense of caring for others. Loudoun Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) volunteers have provided the primary staffing for the County COVID-19 response. They have been critical in helping mediate the factors of this pandemic in the County. MRC volunteers have provided the primary staffing for a number of County activities including providing flu vaccinations. With regards to the County's response to Covid-19 they have been the primary staffing for the current vaccination efforts, mobile Covid testing, the County hotline/call center as well as infection control at the elections and primaries. Doing so has helped mitigate the spread of COVID in Loudoun. Currently there are over 2,000 active volunteers.



Outstanding Corporate Team Volunteers Northwest Federal Credit Union Foundation

Northwest Federal Credit Union (NWFCU) participated in various community outreach efforts. The NWFCU Foundation provided children and young people throughout Loudoun a hand up and security in the face of the pandemic. In 2020 The NWFCU Foundation held the following drives: Backpack Meal Drive, Food for Kids Drive, Diaper Drive, Coat Drive and Kids in Crisis Drive supporting Loudoun and Fairfax communities. Their amazing membership and employee volunteers collected and distributed over 38,000 food items through the Backpack Meal and Food for Kids Drives. The Foundation provided \$20,000 in scholarship money to the NVCC Lifeline and Helping Hands programs and \$110,000 in individual scholarship money to leaders and role models in the community needing financial assistance for college.

BENEFIT Loudoun raised \$20,000 for local nonprofits during the Hope for the Holidays Virtual Concert. The BENEFIT team, all volunteers, organized and executed the entire event from start to finish. This project raised money for deserving nonprofits who tirelessly address the needs of people in our community. The money raised was distributed to recipient nonprofits within 30 days of the event, enabling these organizations to use the resources immediately. The diversity of experience and thought enabled creative solutions to challenges faced in 2020. With safety first in mind, BENEFIT Loudoun pivoted and delivered a virtual event to a live audience that was its most successful event ever.

Bernard Mustafa volunteers at Count the Region, an Initiative of the Community Foundation for Northern Virginia. As Regional Count Committee Co-Chair, Bernard successfully led a regional communication and mobilization effort around the 2020 Census that placed Northern Virginia at the top of response rates in the country. Bernard's efforts were a notable increase in response rate in spite of the disruption of COVID-19. Under his leadership, The Community Foundation successfully planned, created and launched the Northern Virginia Regional Complete Count Committee (NVCCC), leveraging the Community Foundation's local connections, relationships and influence. The NVCCC is the first of its kind.

Throughout 2020, the LCFFF's board worked to find "workarounds" through the murky circumstances that we've all come to know as COVID19. The LCFFF's board maintained their strong commitment to serving the Loudoun community despite the COVID 19 obstacles.

The Young Men's Service Team Oakton Chapter (YMSL) went above and beyond in 2020, serving countless hours in the warehouse, at home, and for Women Giving Back. This special group of young men has been a wonderful partner to Women Giving Back since 2015, serving over 200 hours in 2020, numbering in the thousands throughout the partnership. Scheduling was a challenge with YMSL balancing school hours and volunteer hours during weekdays. But because of the young men's dedication and strong desire to to help, the Oakton Chapter of YMSL found a way to serve their community.



Gabriella Miller

Gabriella Miller was diagnosed with an inoperable brain tumor at 9 years old. Gabriella was named the 2012 Outstanding Volunteer of the Year for her efforts in raising more than \$275,000 for the Make a Wish Foundation.

Realizing how little awareness and funding there was for childhood cancer and particularly childhood brain cancer, Gabriella quickly became a global advocate for children with cancer and started the Smashing Walnuts Foundation.

Gabriella was only 10 years old when she passed away in 2013. Her family now continues her mission of awareness. Smashing Walnuts is Gabriella's legacy, founded to give kids like her a fighting chance.

GABRIELLA MILLER YOUTH AWARD

Christian's year of volunteer work for 2020 started as an Minority Student Achievement Advisory Committee (MSAAC) Student Delegate. Christian gave his insight as to how LCPS can build an equitable and socially responsible environment for students.

However, days after Christian was recognized with the 2020 MSAAC Student Award, his world, and his ways of advocacy, were changed forever. Christian faced the devastating news that his best friend, Fitz Campbell Thomas, passed away. Days after his passing, Christian and Fitz's mother teamed up to co-found Justice 4 Fitz. With Justice 4 Fitz, they changed public safety laws in Loudoun and Montgomery County to enhance 9-1-1 responses. Since then, Christian was appointed to a Public Safety Reform Workgroup with PSAP (public safety answering points) and 9-1-1 Representatives throughout Virginia. Eventually, the workgroup will report to Governor Ralph Northam. Christian made sure to honor Fitz as well. In October of 2020, the initiative he led to rename Riverside High School's Stadium after Fitz came to reality.

RiseUp AWARD

Dr. John Farrell



As Chairman of the Loudoun County Health Commission, Dr. John Farrell advises the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors regarding health issues and policy in Loudoun. Early in the pandemic, local healthcare providers were struggling to obtain enough personal protective equipment to treat all the patients coming through their doors. Dr. Farrell worked with the Board of Supervisors, County administration, and Health Director Dr. David Goodfriend to ensure that medical practices throughout Loudoun had sufficient PPE. When lack of readily available testing, and confusion about the accuracy of tests, became an issue, Dr. Farrell started Loudoun's COVID-19 Testing Task Force. The Task Force is a group of healthcare professionals and government officials whose mission is to expand testing capabilities in the County. With the help of Supervisor Matt LeTourneau and the Loudoun County Government, Dr. Farrell launched the Loudoun County PPE website to address the severe shortage of PPE. This made a huge difference in keeping practices open and able to serve the community. Supervisor Matt LeTourneau: "This year, Dr. Farrell has been indispensable in assisting the County with our COVID-19 response."

SERVICE OF A LIFETIME AWARD Dennis Godfrey



Dennis Godfrey has been volunteering in our community for over 20 years. He has served at Catholic Charities Diocese of Arlington, Knights of Columbus, KOVAR and Odyssey of the Mind. Dennis's involvement with the Knights of Columbus began with his fellow Knights in the creation of a new Chapter at his parish. He served as President of the St. Francis Chapter and District Warden with many years on the KOVAR Board, the Knights' state level nonprofit. Christina Harrington, the Catholic Charities Loudoun Food Pantry Manager, exclaims "the pantry would not be what it is today without Dennis's valuable contributions over the past 10 years and what strikes me the most about working with Dennis is his ingenuity and generosity, especially when there is a need to help others." For over 20+ years Dennis volunteered at the local, state, and National/International level of Odyssey of the Mind (OM), a youth creative thinking competition. The Spirit Award, a World Award, is given to one individual every year and Dennis received it at the 2019 World OM Competition. This was in recognition for his volunteer service in many positions at the local, state, and national levels: Assistant Coach, Judge for Virginia Regionals and World Finals, Regional and Virginia State Spontaneous Captains and Virginia Association Director. Dennis currently serves as Treasurer for the World Board.
